ACTS 4:13-21

13 Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated, common men, they were astonished. And they recognized that they had been with Jesus. ¹⁴ But seeing the man who was healed standing beside them, they had nothing to say in opposition. ¹⁵ But when they had commanded them to leave the council, they conferred with one another, ¹⁶ saying, "What shall we do with these men? For that a notable sign has been performed through them is evident to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and we cannot deny it. ¹⁷ But in order that it may spread no further among the people, let us warn them to speak no more to anyone in this name." 18 So they called them and charged them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. ¹⁹ But Peter and John answered them, "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you rather than to God, you must judge, ²⁰ for we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard." ²¹ And when they had further threatened them, they let them go, finding no way to punish them, because of the people, for all were praising God for what had happened.

¹² "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father. ¹³ Whatever you ask in my name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ If you ask me anything in my name, I will do it.

Reflection Questions

- Jesus's followers often learned from him while in a crowd and the Holy Spirit fell upon a crowd of 120 gathered in the upper room. Clearly, spending time with Jesus and being filled with the Holy Spirit can take place in the company of others. If anything, it is more likely. Why? What if that company of others included people of color?
- Jesus says He is the way, the truth and the life—very exclusive claims in this syncretistic pluralistic world. How is His claim an anchor for you as you enter into conversations with others and as you seek to be his heart, hand and voice?
- How does knowing the end of the story (someday "every knee will bow and every tongue confess Jesus as Lord") help us to live boldly and justly, now?
