Sermon

The Nicene Creed

Ash Wednesday, February 17

The season of Lent is a forty day period of penitence, fasting, and prayer, in preparation for the great feast of the resurrection at Easter. "The forty days refer to our Lord's time of fasting in the wilderness; and since Sundays are never fast days, Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the Lenten Fast." BCP(2019), p. 542

Our Ash Wednesday service will be held at the Gathering Place, 7 a.m. & 7 p.m. and will last approximately 45 minutes (3245 New Brighton Rd, Arden Hills, MN 55112).
