Thus says the Lord God concerning Edom: We have heard a report from the Lord, and a messenger has been sent among the nations: "Rise up! Let us rise against her for battle!" ² Behold, I will make you small among the nations; you shall be utterly despised. ³ The pride of your heart has deceived you, you who live in the clefts of the rock, in your lofty dwelling, who say in your heart, "Who will bring me down to the ground?" ⁴ Though you soar aloft like the eagle, though your nest is set among the stars, from there I will bring you down, declares the Lord. ⁵ If thieves came to you, if plunderers came by night how you have been destroyed!would they not steal only enough for themselves? If grape gatherers came to you, would they not leave gleanings? ⁶ How Esau has been pillaged, his treasures sought out! ⁷ All your allies have driven you to your border; those at peace with you have deceived you; they have prevailed against you; those who eat your bread have set a trap beneath youyou have no understanding. ⁸ Will I not on that day, declares the Lord, destroy the wise men out of Edom, and understanding out of Mount Esau? ⁹ And your mighty men shall be dismayed, O Teman,

so that every man from Mount Esau will be cut off by slaughter.

As you have done, it shall be done to you; your deeds shall return on your own head. ¹⁶ For as you have drunk on my holy mountain, so all the nations shall drink continually; they shall drink and swallow, and shall be as though they had never been. ¹⁷ But in Mount Zion there shall be those who escape, and it shall be holy, and the house of Jacob shall possess their own possessions. ¹⁸ The house of Jacob shall be a fire, and the house of Joseph a flame, and the house of Esau stubble; they shall burn them and consume them, and there shall be no survivor for the house of Esau, for the Lord has spoken. ¹⁹ Those of the Negeb shall possess Mount Esau, and those of the Shephelah shall possess the land of the Philistines; they shall possess the land of Ephraim and the land of Samaria, and Benjamin shall possess Gilead. ²⁰ The exiles of this host of the people of Israel shall possess the land of the Canaanites as far as Zarephath, and the exiles of Jerusalem who are in Sepharad

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.



Directions for Communion

All baptized believers in Jesus Christ are welcome to receive Communion. However, if you are not able to receive you may remain seated or come forward for a prayer of blessing from one of our ministers. Please indicate your desire for a prayer of blessing by crossing your arms across your chest.

You will be dismissed to receive by one of our greeters. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. Please extend your hand to receive the bread and the cup and move toward the basket to consume the elements before returning to your seat. Please place the empty cup in the basket to the right or left of the server before you return to your seat.

If you would like to receive prayer for physical, emotional, or spiritual needs, prayer ministers are available at the rear of the sanctuary to pray with you during our communion worship and for a short time after the service. If others are being prayed for, you may wait in a nearby pew. This time of prayer is considered private and confidential, and whatever you share with prayer ministers will not be brought up again by them unless you initiate.

BUILDING TEAM UPDATE

"But blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in him. They will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. - Jer. 17:7-8a

Over the coming ministry year, the whole church is invited to join in prayer, preparation, and petition; asking God, our Father, to plant Church of the Redeemer in a place where we can put down deep roots. Last month, our building committee met to outline our hopes for a permanent church home. We want to communicate that:

- Our relationship with Calvary is strong. The church leaders have been welcoming and gracious to us, but meeting in their sanctuary isn't meant to be a long-term arrangement.
- Our goal is to stay in the east metro, with St. Paul and its inner suburbs as the heart of our search.
- We desire a physical location that provides beauty in our worship experience, safety for our children, and flexibility for missions and outreach.
- As we pursue a new site, we hope to build our relationship with our sister congregation, St. John's Karen Anglican.
- We recognize the realities of the market. What we want in a building is exactly what other growing congregations desire; any potential property listings are going to require prayerful but quick decisions.

We are asking you to:

- Pray that God would provide a building.
- Pray for the work of the building committee: Roger Christensen, Dan Leafblad, Jordan Schroeder, Holly Willmarth, and Fr. Paul.
- Pray for our congregation, as any change, even one that is longawaited, can bring stress and uncertainty.
- Prepare to give financially toward the purchase and maintenance of a building.
- Be our eyes and ears in your neighborhoods and networks. As in home buying, sometimes church properties sell through the grapevine. Help us in our search.

HOLY BAPTISM

Sunday, November 7, 4:30 p.m.

"In baptism we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are made regenerate by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." (The Book of Common Prayer, 2019, p. 168)

All Saints' Sunday, Nov. 7, is an especially appropriate occasion to celebrate the sacrament of Baptism. If you would like to be baptized, or to present your child for baptism, please contact Fr. Paul or another member of our clergy.
