The service will begin with a time of silent prayer and reflection.

Celebrant: Blessed be our God. People: Now and for ever. Amen.

Almighty God, we pray you graciously to behold this your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, and given into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the cross; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Word of God

Genesis 22:1-18

After these things God tested Abraham and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." ² He said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." ³ So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac. And he cut the wood for the burnt offering and arose and went to the place of which God had told him. 4 On the third day Abraham lifted up his eyes and saw the place from afar. ⁵ Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; I and the boy will go over there and worship and come again to you." 6 And Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son. And he took in his hand the fire and the knife. So they went both of them together. ⁷ And Isaac said to his father Abraham, "My father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." He said, "Behold, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" 8 Abraham said, "God will provide for himself the lamb for a burnt offering, my son." So they went both of them together.

⁹ When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built the altar there and laid the wood in order and bound Isaac his son and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. ¹⁰ Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to slaughter his son. ¹¹ But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." ¹² He said, "Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him, for now I know that you fear God, seeing you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me." ¹³ And Abraham lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, behind him was a ram, caught in a thicket by his horns. And Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his son. ¹⁴ So Abraham

called the name of that place, "The Lord will provide"; as it is said to this day, "On the mount of the Lord it shall be provided."

¹⁵ And the angel of the Lord called to Abraham a second time from heaven ¹⁶ and said, "By myself I have sworn, declares the Lord, because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your only son, ¹⁷ I will surely bless you, and I will surely multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven and as the sand that is on the seashore. And your offspring shall possess the gate of his enemies, ¹⁸ and in your offspring shall all the nations of the earth be blessed, because you have obeyed my voice."

The Holy Bible, ESV

Reader: The Word of the Lord People: Thanks be to God.

Hebrews 10:1-25

For since the law has but a shadow of the good things to come instead of the true form of these realities, it can never, by the same sacrifices that are continually offered every year, make perfect those who draw near. ² Otherwise, would they not have ceased to be offered, since the worshipers, having once been cleansed, would no longer have any consciousness of sins? ³ But in these sacrifices there is a reminder of sins every year. ⁴ For it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins.

- ⁵ Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said,
 - "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body have you prepared for me;
 - ⁶ in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure.
 - ⁷Then I said, 'Behold, I have come to do your will, O God, as it is written of me in the scroll of the book.'"
- ⁸ When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), ⁹ then he added, "Behold, I have come to do your will." He does away with the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰ And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.
- ¹¹ And every priest stands daily at his service, offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. ¹² But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, ¹³ waiting from that time until his enemies should be made a footstool for his feet. ¹⁴ For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified.

 15 And the Holy Spirit also bears witness to us; for after saying, 16 "This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, declares the Lord:

I will put my laws on their hearts, and write them on their minds,"

¹⁷then he adds,

"I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more."

18Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin.

¹⁹ Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, ²¹and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²²let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

JOHN 19:1-37 & PSALM 22:1-21

Congregation is to read the part of the "People" at the points noted in the reading below.

^{19:1} Then Pilate took Jesus and flogged him. ² And the soldiers twisted together a crown of thorns and put it on his head and arrayed him in a purple robe. ³ They came up to him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" and struck him with their hands. ⁴ Pilate went out again and said to them, "See, I am bringing him out to you that you may know that I find no guilt in him." ⁵ So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them, "Behold the man!" ⁶ When the chief priests and the officers saw him, they cried out,

People: "Crucify him, crucify him!"

- My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? and are so far from my cry and from the words of my distress?
- ² O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer; by night as well, but I find no rest.
- ³ Yet you are the Holy One, enthroned upon the praises of Israel.
- Our forefathers put their trust in you; they trusted, and you delivered them.

John 19:6b-11

- They cried out to you and were delivered; they trusted in you and were not put to shame.
- ⁶ But as for me, I am a worm and no man, scorned by all and despised by the people.
- All who see me laugh me to scorn; they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,
- 8 "He trusted in the Lord; let him deliver him; let him rescue him, if he delights in him."
- ⁹ Yet you are he who took me out of the womb, and kept me safe upon my mother's breast.
- ¹⁰ I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born; you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb.

^{19:12}From then on Pilate sought to release him, but the Jews cried out,

People: "If you release this man, you are not Caesar's friend. Everyone who makes himself a king opposes Caesar."

¹³ So when Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judgment seat at a place called The Stone Pavement, and in Aramaic Gabbatha. ¹⁴ Now it was the day of Preparation of the Passover. It was about the sixth hour. He said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" ¹⁵ They cried out,



People: "Away with him, away with him, crucify him!"

Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered,

People: "We have no king but Caesar."

^{16a} So he delivered him over to them to be crucified.

- ¹¹ Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is none to help.
- Many young bulls encircle me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me.
- ¹³ They open wide their jaws at me, like a ravening and a roaring lion.
- ¹⁴ I am poured out like water; all my bones are out of joint; my heart within my breast is melting wax.

15 My mouth is dried out like a pot-sherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; and you have laid me in the dust of the grave.
 16 Packs of dogs close me in, and gangs of evildoers circle around me; they pierce my hands and my feet; I can count

all my bones.

They stare and gloat over me;

they divide my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing.

¹⁸ Be not far away, O Lord;

you are my strength; hasten to help me.

19 Save me from the sword, my life from the power of the dog.

Save me from the lion's mouth, my wretched body from the horns of wild bulls.

²¹ I will declare your Name to my brethren; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you.

Special Offering

Tonight's special offering will support relief efforts in Ukraine administrated by a Minnesota-based ministry called Shepherd's Foundation. Several members of Church of the Redeemer have travelled-to and/or have personal connections in Ukraine through this ministry. Since the start of the Russian invasion, a camp owned by Shepherd's Foundation has served as a transit hub for refugees and relief supplies. Drivers are driving into combat zones in the east, transporting people–especially those with disabilities and other vulnerabilities– overnight to the camp, and then from there to western Ukraine.


PRAYER AT THE CROSS

People: O come, let us adore him.




Leader: May God be merciful to us and bless us, show us the light of his countenance, and come to us. Let your ways be known upon earth, your saving health among all nations.

Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you.


